



WHEREAS, the City of Horicon on November 17, 2009 adopted the City of Horicon Comprehensive Plan under the authority of and procedures established by §66.1001(4), Wisconsin Statutes; and

WHEREAS, that Comprehensive Plan document advises both the regular Plan Commission review of the Comprehensive Plan, as well as the ability to respond to unique circumstances which arise in relation to the Comprehensive Plan which are distinct from the regular plan review process, and to enable the City's consideration of potential amendments and updates where the Plan becomes irrelevant or contradictory to emerging policy or trends; and

WHEREAS, §66.1001(4)(a), Wisconsin Statutes, requires that the governing body of the local governmental unit adopt written procedures designed to foster public participation at every stage of the comprehensive plan preparation or update process, and that such written procedures shall provide for wide distribution of draft plan materials, an opportunity for the public to submit written comments on the plan materials, and a process for the governing body to respond to such comments; and

WHEREAS, the City of Horicon believes that meaningful public involvement in processes designed to consider and update its Comprehensive Plan is important to assure that the resulting Plan meets the wishes and expectations of the public; and

WHEREAS, the attached "Public Participation Strategy and Procedures for the City of Horicon Comprehensive Plan Update" includes procedures to foster public participation, ensure distribution of draft plan materials, provide opportunities for written comments on such materials, and provide mechanisms to respond to such comments.; and

WHEREAS, at a duly noticed public meeting held on June 18, 2020, the City of Horicon Plan Commission adopted Resolution 2020-01 recommending that the Horicon Common Council adopt the attached "Public Participation Strategy and Procedures for the City of Horicon Comprehensive Plan Update" as its public participation procedures for updating the City's Comprehensive Plan.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Common Council of the City of Horicon hereby adopts the procedures included in the "Public Participation Strategy and Procedures the City of Horicon Comprehensive Plan Update, 2020" as its public participation procedures for periodic amendments to the City's Comprehensive Plan, meeting the requirements of §66.1001(4)(a), Wisconsin Statutes.

**PUBLIC PARTICIPATION STRATEGY AND PROCEDURES
FOR THE CITY OF HORICON
COMPREHENSIVE PLAN UPDATE
2020**

Introduction

A key required component of Section 66.1001 of Wisconsin Statutes—the State’s comprehensive planning legislation—is actively involving community stakeholders as each local comprehensive plan is being developed, updated, or amended. Public participation helps to ensure that the resulting comprehensive plan accurately reflects the vision, goals, and values of citizens of the community.

Section 66.1001(4)(a) of Wisconsin Statutes requires the City of Horicon to adopt, by resolution, written procedures designed to foster public participation at every stage in the preparation, update, or subsequent amendment of its comprehensive plan. The written procedures must provide for wide distribution of the comprehensive plan, an opportunity for the public to submit written comments on the plan, and provisions for local response to such comments.

This document meets this statutory requirement. It serves as the procedures that will be used to guide the required ten-year update to the City’s Comprehensive Plan, which was adopted on November 17, 2009.

Major Goals of Public Participation Strategy

- Provide opportunities for members of the public to participate in the process and to help consider and adopt a complete update to the City’s Comprehensive Plan.
- Adopt an updated plan that reflect the ideas, desires, and objectives of most residents and property owners.
- Meet both the letter and spirit of Wisconsin’s Comprehensive Plan legislation.
- Use the City’s Plan Commission as a foundation for guiding the plan update process.
- Recognize that the goals expressed above must be balanced with the need to complete the Comprehensive Plan update within a reasonable timeframe.

Selected Public Participation Techniques

The City will, at a minimum, use the following techniques to obtain public input during the plan update process:

- Assure that all Plan Commission and Common Council meetings consider and adopt the updated plan, are open to the public, and are noticed as required by State open meeting regulations.
- Establish a process for members of the public to nominate changes to the City’s Future Land Use Map for consideration by the Common Council and Plan Commission.
- Public comments will be solicited and responded to at every stage of the planning process.
- Hold one public open house to review the draft plan. This drop-in meeting will be open to the public and advertised in advance.
- Provide an opportunity at each public meeting held on the Comprehensive Plan update for public comment. Some meetings will be particularly meant to encourage wide participation from the public. Other meetings are intended to be work sessions for the Plan Commission, Common Council, or some combination. The public comment period will be provided at either the beginning or end of each public meeting, or at one or more other parts of the meeting at the

discretion of the Plan Commission or Common Council. This will allow the Commission or Council to concentrate on completing tasks without interruption, while still allowing the public an appropriate chance to observe and comment.

- Hold at least one formal public hearing on the proposed Comprehensive Plan update and the adopting ordinance prior to adoption. All members of the public will have an opportunity to present testimony and offer comments at the public hearing. The public hearing will be noticed and held per the requirements of Wisconsin Statutes, Section 66.1001.

Opportunities for Comments/Responses on Draft Comprehensive Plan

The City will have copies of all draft plan materials available online or at City Hall and the Library during normal business hours. The City will also provide copies of the draft and final plan to adjacent and overlapping governments and non-metallic mineral interests as required by statute, and to members of the participating public as requested. The City may charge for public copies an amount equal to the costs of time and materials to produce such copies.

Public comments will be solicited and responded to at every stage of the plan update process. Written comments on the comprehensive plan update may also be delivered, mailed, faxed, or emailed to the City Clerk-Treasurer. The City will respond to written comments via mail, email, fax, telephone, meeting, and/or through consideration of appropriate changes to the draft comprehensive plan.

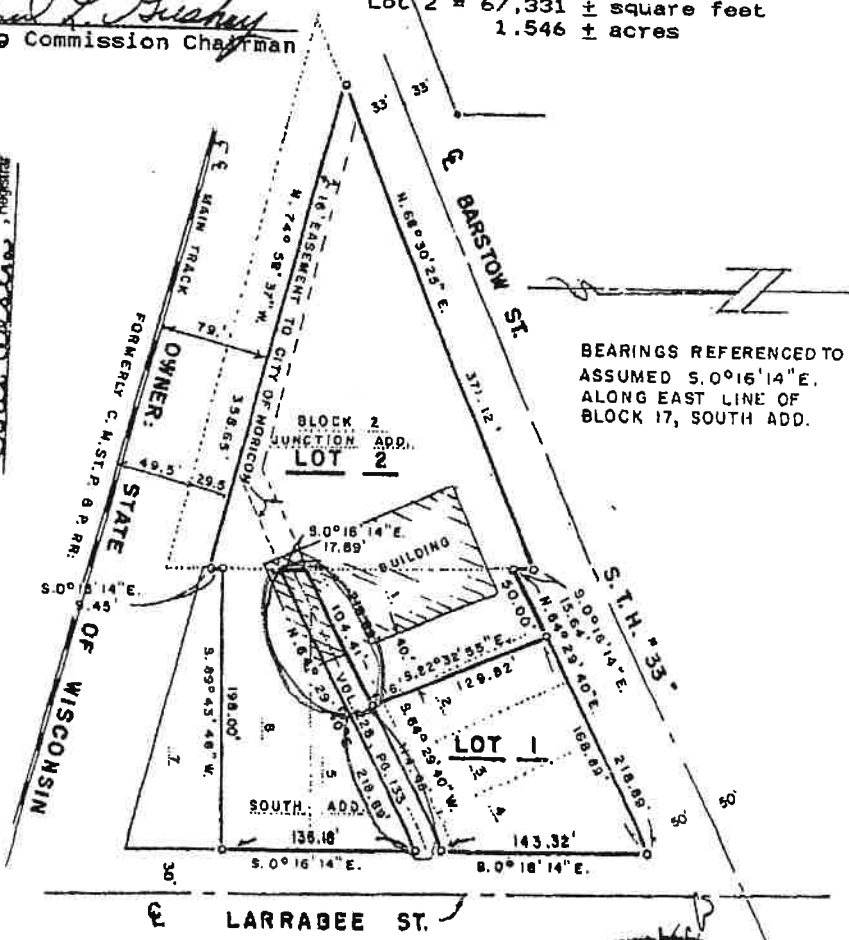

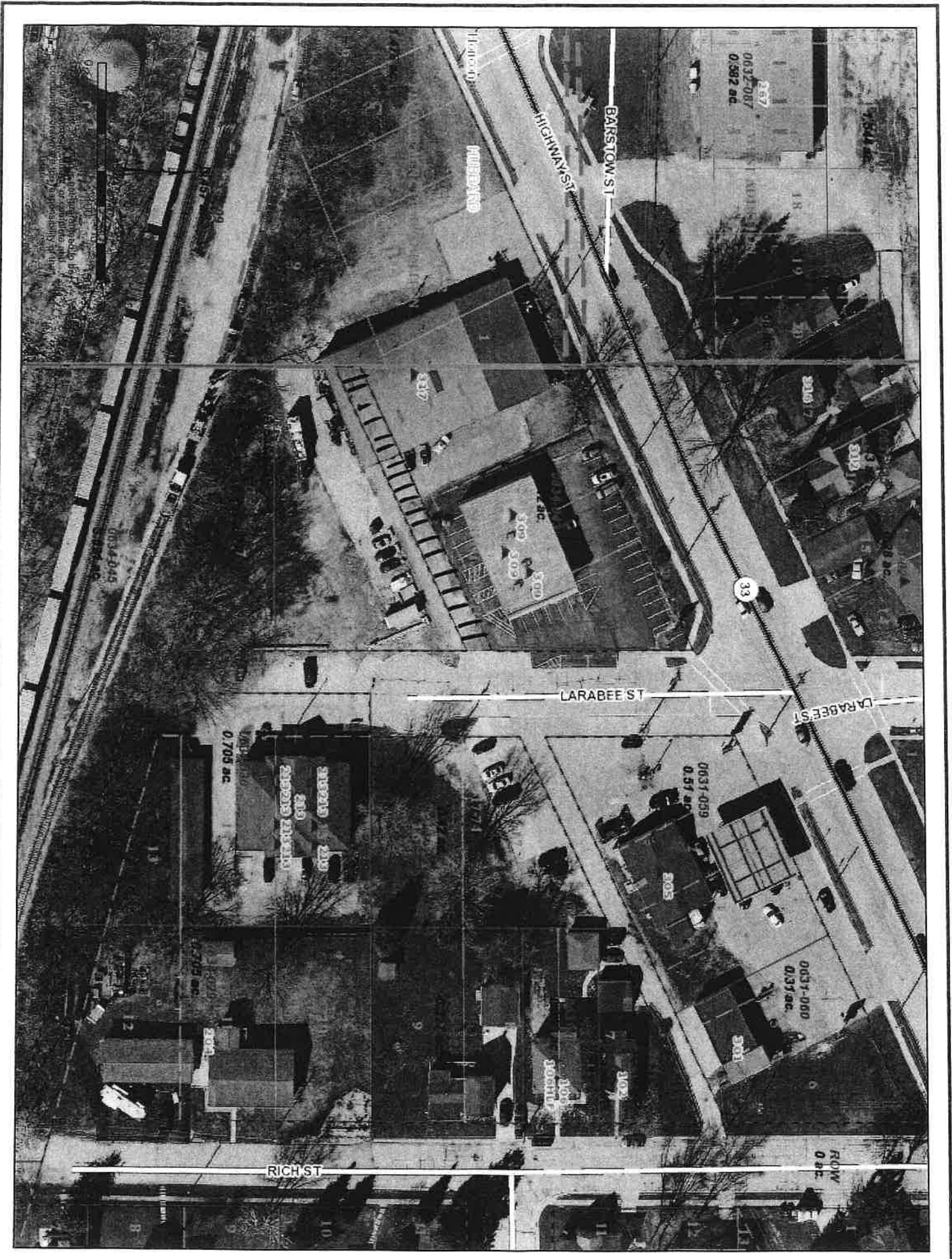

Non-Action Discussion:

Alexandra Harvancik, Librarian, announced the Library opened to the public on May 26th with new guidelines, she added the guidelines are working well but business is slow. She also announced the new curbside parking stall is available and is permanent. Harvancik stated the Summer Reading Program started June 15th and concludes August 22nd. Harvancik stated the Library is trying to find creative ways to do story time outside and intends to provide to go crafts at the Horicon Phoenix Program's Music in the Market. Harvancik announced she will be out of the office July 15 – 29.

Joseph Adamson, Police Chief, stated there has been an increase in vehicle licensing at the Police Station due to DMV COVID restrictions. Adamson stated he appreciated the help Alexandra Harvancik and Werner Biederman provided during the City's COVID declared emergency. Adamson announced approximately 65 geese were harvested with the depredation permit this year.

Mark Tesch, Fire Chief, announced there were new appointments to Fire Officers and he is encouraging members to take additional schooling.

Tim Kingman, Director of Public Works-Utilities, announced the East Lake Street Manhole and Pavement Repair Project is complete and under budget. Kingman also announced all parks, restrooms, and the pool are open with some adjustments. Kingman stated the utilities are working on hydrant flushing. He also stated a new chemical application at the wastewater treatment plant appears to be working well. Kingman stated the pool is doing well and is booking up to their 75 person capacity.

Vanderhei encouraged the City to look into dental insurance provided by the State at no cost to the employer.

Hady stated it was a joy to see everyone in person. Hady requested an update on the former Wrucke Property.

Bandsma stated he witnessed one of the City's Police Officer's exercise great patience with an individual and commended him on a job well done.

Miller inquired if individual committee meetings could be held at City Hall.

Jacobson stated she will be communicating with Department Heads to track expenses related to COVID to submit for grant reimbursement.

Mayor Grigg congratulated Linda Kane on her induction into the Horicon High School Alumni Wall of Fame. Mayor Grigg stated if anyone is uncomfortable with in person meetings, we can resume virtual meetings.

Motion by Vanderhei, second by Marschke, to adjourn.
